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EURES Targeted Mobility Scheme – support for labor mobility in Europe

When you attend a job interview or relocate to another EU country, Norway, or Iceland for work, you may be eligible for financial support from the EURES Targeted Mobility Scheme.

The EURES Targeted Mobility Scheme projects provide financial support to promote labor mobility within the EU, Norway, and Iceland. The projects are coordinated by the public employment services of Sweden, Germany, and Italy, in cooperation with the European Employment Services network (EURES).

You can receive support to cover the following costs:

- Travel expenses for attending a job interview
- Costs related to relocating and settling in the target country
- Costs related to the recognition of qualifications
- Participation in a language course
- Relocation costs for you and your family

Target group and conditions

Eligibility criteria for applying for financial support from the EURES Targeted Mobility Scheme:

- You are at least 18 years old
- You are a citizen of an EU country, Norway, or Iceland, or a long-term resident of an EU country, Norway, or Iceland

- You are looking for work in another EU country, Norway, or Iceland
- You have been in contact with EURES and received advice on how to apply for financial support
- You have an employment contract with a minimum duration of 6 months, or 3–6 months in the case of a traineeship
- The employer indicated in the employment contract must be the same as the one indicated in the support application
- You work for the whole period, i.e. at least the required 6 months, otherwise the support may be fully recovered
- Your working hours are at least 50% of those of a full-time employee
- The terms of employment comply with national labor market legislation and practices, such as minimum wage requirements and relevant collective agreements

- The employer pays a salary that is not based on performance or commission only
- You are not receiving support from other sources, such as employers, other projects, or public authorities. Such support may include reimbursement of travel expenses or accommodation costs
- You are not a posted worker
- You are not returning to work in your home country or in a country where you have previously lived, studied, or worked

Please also note the following when applying for support:

- The application for financial support must be submitted in due

time, at least one week before the job interview or three weeks before the start of employment

- You need to attach a copy of the job posting to your application
- The financial supports are one-time grants, i.e. they are paid only once after the application has been approved
- To be eligible, you must consult a EURES Adviser for guidance before submitting your application
